From the Pastors 2020-21 Ministry Year Focus: "Connected in Faith"

1) Connecting with God - Drawing near with a true heart.

Let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water (Hebrews 10:22).

2) Connecting with our Church Family - Holding fast the confession of our hope. Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful (Hebrews 10:23).

3) Connecting with our Community - Stirring up one another to love & good works.

And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works (Hebrews 10:24).

This month we take another look at the second theme of our ministry year focus, as we contemplate what it looks like to "Connect with our Church Family – Holding fast the confession of our hope" (see #2 above).

There are many things that try to pull us apart as a church. We face external and internal forces that in subtle and not-so-subtle ways try to drive divisions into our midst. We face external forces that range from the busyness of modern life to the ease of our mobility through technology and travel, from the pressures of life in a politicized world to the preferences of an increasingly individualistic society. But we also face internal forces as well. Divisions can arise from our differing worship preferences to our opposing opinions in our responses to the current pandemic realities to our personal perspective of how our faith informs our vocation in the world.

These trials are nothing new. The church has always wrestled with the struggles of life within a sinful world. The author of Hebrews, however, directs our focus not to what may divide us but to the essence of what draws the church together—our confession of hope (Hebrews 10:23). It is our confession of who Jesus is that draws us as the church together from various backgrounds, diverse perspectives, differing political parties, and a variety of personal life stories. It is the unified confession of who Jesus is that draws us to one another. More and more we hear the concern that many in our time are withdrawing from wider community engagement into fewer and fewer personal connections only with people who look like them, act like them, and think like them. The church, on the other hand, is meant to be a place of unity, not uniformity. The church is meant to be a place where we learn and grow from our collective experience, not just our individual perspective.

In C.S. Lewis' book *The Screwtape Letters* two evil tempters converse with one another about how to lead a recently converted man away from his newfound faith. The following words are insightful, "In the first place the parochial organization [of the church] should always be attacked, because, being a unity of place and not of likings, it brings people of different classes and psychology together in the kind of unity the Enemy desires. The congregational principle, on the other hand, makes each church into a kind of club..." The church, however, is more than a club, we are a people united in our shared faith in Jesus. We are a part of a community that has transcended time and space and culture, for Christ alone is the one who draws us together in His forgiving love and gracious sacrifice on our behalf. As we hold fast together, on our confession of this faith, we reflect upon what it means to be "His" church.

<u>Mindfulness</u>

What is your earliest memory? How far back does that take you? When was the last time that this memory came to mind? I would imagine that we all have different ages when we first remembered something. Our memories come to us at times triggered by perhaps a song, a photograph, or some words printed or spoken.

February 2nd came and went like every other day. Yet for my family February 2, 2018 was not a normal day. February 2nd marked the third anniversary of my father's funeral. Yet that did not come to mind for me until February 3rd. I began feeling guilty for not being mindful of that day. Did that diminish my Father's memory? Would time continue to lessen his life's journey and impact on me?

Being mindful brings the needs of the day to light. Time does indeed take our finite abilities and absorb and lessen the magnitude of our memories. As emotionally saturated 2/2/18 was for our family, 2/2/21 was not.

God is mindful of the needs of His People. In Jeremiah 1:5, God tells us that before we were in our mother's womb, He knew us. Luke acknowledges that God is so ever mindful that He knows the very number of hairs on our heads.

Take your own earliest memory and know that God was there. He never forgets or becomes distracted from His loving care and touch in all of our lives. We are to be mindful as well to the needs of others as God equips us to do. During this season of Lent, we see even more clearly God's mindfulness to all eternity as He sent Jesus to suffer and to die on the cross for our salvation granting to those through faith new life. Postcard Promoting Our Church and School

Please see the newsletter article from the Communications team highlighting a recent postcard campaign to share information about Calvary with our local community. An Update from Calvary's 1st Year Seminarian, Aaron Levenhagen

As I write this, we're already a couple of weeks into the second semester and have returned to In-person instruction. Here's a quick update on my current coursework and field work.

<u>The Pastor and the Church in Mission</u> – this is a half-semester course taught by Dr. William Schumacher focusing on the dynamics of missional outreach, cross-cultural communication, and bringing the message of the gospel into different contexts.

<u>Homiletics</u> – here we learn the theology and practice of preaching. I'll be writing several sermons and will be receiving both instructor and peer feedback. A definite mix of anticipation and terror! For this course, I'm studying with Dr. Peter Nafzger.

<u>Synoptic Gospels</u> – this half-semester course introduces the first three Gospels. My section will be doing an in- depth exegetical study of the Gospel of Luke. I'm privileged to be taught by Dr. Jeffrey Oschwald.

<u>Creeds and Confessions</u> – this course is the second systematics course in the curriculum. We're studying the Ecumenical Creeds and the Lutheran Confessions in the Book of Concord. I'm very excited to be studying with Dr. Robert Kolb, who is one of, if not THE foremost translator and scholar of the Lutheran Confessions.

<u>Formation Group</u> – once a week, I have the opportunity to meet with a small group of fellow first-year seminarians to not only learn about various topics in preparation for ministry but also to support and pray for each other. This group will stay together throughout my time at the seminary and is mentored by Dr. Dale Meyer.

<u>Field Work</u> – I continue to have the opportunity to lead liturgy and teach adult Bible classes. This semester I'm also giving the occasional children's sermon and helping with worship at a local senior center. I'll also be preaching my first homily during on of the midweek Lenten services next month.
