From the Pastors

As I sit down to write my December / January newsletter, I can't help but feel like there's only one good answer for what I will write. December is a month of giving. January is our stewardship month. And today (as I write this in November), I'm preaching on Giving for the *Red Letter Challenge*. I think we have a theme.

Whether or not you attended that service and heard that sermon, it's relevant to note that I quote many Bible passages on giving in that message. For the sake of time, I didn't quote them all, but multiple members came up to me to point out one verse in particular that I left out: "The Lord loves a cheerful giver."

This verse is in 2 Corinthians 9, and though it's useful by itself, I think we should look at the broader context.

⁶ The point is this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. ⁷ Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. ⁸ And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that having all sufficiency in all things at all times, you may abound in every good work. ⁹ As it is written, "He has distributed freely, he has given to the poor; his righteousness endures forever." ¹⁰ He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness.

Paul's laying out some amazing teaching and encouragement here, but it's difficult stuff, too. First, a warning—if you sow sparingly you reap sparingly—then, a promise—if you sow bountifully you reap bountifully. Next, Paul makes the controversial statement that we should not give under compulsion or reluctantly! Your giving should be free and cheerful, for three reasons.

One, the Lord loves a cheerful giver. We should give because it makes God happy, just like we give to our kids and loved ones at Christmas time, simply because we delight in their happiness.

Two, God is able to make all grace abound to you, such that we have enough. We give because God is powerful enough to give us enough. He is powerful enough to equip us to do his work. We give because we trust him to use that power for our good.

Three, God has promised to do it, too. Not only is he powerful enough to give, but he has promised to give. He has promised to *multiply* the gifts he has given to us so that we can use those gifts to bless others.

What a beautiful passage. What beautiful promises! But I must admit, sometimes it's hard to trust God when we worry about having enough. This is where faith comes in. As the Lord says in Malachi 3, "Test me in this." Use the gifts given to you, and see what he does. Each little step of obedience is a movement toward faith. Each step of faith is a movement toward the cheer and even joy which Paul encourages in this chapter. All year long, let's trust God with our giving!

Stewardship Update By Jake Allen, Stewardship Ministry Team Director

Calvary Endowment Funds Update – Church Endowment Funds

This month the Stewardship Ministry is making the third of three reports on each of Calvary's three endowment funds: 1) The Church Endowment Fund – discussed in the October Newsletter; 2) The Schwark Endowment Fund – discussed in the November newsletter; and 3) The Wessler Endowment Fund. Each of these funds serve a distinct purpose in our Ministry. This month we will discuss the Wessler Endowment Fund.

Wessler Endowment Fund

Established in 2018, the Wessler Endowment Fund provides scholarship support for members studying to be church workers. The current market value is \$107,577 (October 31,2021). Recent grants from the endowment have been used to support Sam Troemel's tuition for his specific ministry pastor program and Aaron Levenhagen's studies at our LCMS seminary in St. Louis.

Prayerfully consider this opportunity to support the studies of our future church workers. You may contribute to the endowment fund through a gift of cash or stock, naming the endowment in your will or as a beneficiary on your life insurance policy, pension plan (401k) or IRA. To give using your offering envelope, mark "Wessler Endowment Fund" on your envelope. For questions about the Wessler Endowment Fund, contact Kyle Allen.

Quarterly Mission Envelopes

Calvary generously supports many mission initiatives through our giving. The beneficiaries of these gifts include local ministries (Lutheran High School and the Hispanic Ministry for example) as well as international efforts (examples include Mission India and the El Salvador Mission). Many of these initiatives are funded from our annual budget and many others are funded by individual gifts to these efforts.

An important source of mission funds are the gifts received through the quarterly envelopes that are included in the giving envelope packets. Most recently, the mission envelopes for the 3rd and 4th quarter of the prior fiscal year (year ended July 31, 2021) were designated to provide support to our Chris and Alie Fiorello through Wycliffe Bible Translators. The gifts for the two quarters totaled over \$1,500.

Reduce Your State Taxes – Please Consider a Gift to theLutheran Scholarship Granting Organization (SGO)

This is a reminder that gifts to the Scholarship Granting Organization may be eligible for a 50% credit on your Indiana State Income Taxes. There may be federal tax benefits as well. Details can be found at <u>https://lutheransgo.org/</u>. There is also a more detailed explanation of the benefits of SGOs in Calvary's August newsletter.

Status of Calvary SGO giving year to date: Thanks to everyone who has already made a gift to the SGO for the benefit of Calvary. As of early November, over \$50,000 is still needed to get to our SGO funds target by year end. Please be aware that the tax credits that the State of Indiana has set aside are limited and many other schools are also utilizing these funds. Therefore, it is important to consider making your gift sooner than later before the pool of available tax credits is all used up. For questions about SGO giving, please contact Jennifer Skojac..

State Tax Credit Information

Too Good To Be True?! 50% TAX CREDIT for Indiana tax liabilities!

God has provided a unique opportunity to help fund the Christian education of our Calvary students. The Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization of Indiana has been identified as a Scholarship Granting Organization. Scholarships through private and corporate donations are granted to Calvary student families whose income is less than 300% of the Federal free or reduced hot lunch guidelines.

Multiple Benefits for Calvary Lutheran School students, the private or corporate donor, and Calvary Lutheran Church

- 1. Students and their families accepted in this program will receive a scholarship grant per child enrolled in Kindergarten -8th grade at Calvary.
- 2. The donor will receive a 50% Indiana State tax credit for every dollar donated. Example: A donation of \$1000.00 will result in a tax credit of \$500.00 towards your Indiana income tax liability. Private as well as corporate donations will receive this benefit. A Federal charitable deduction may also be realized.

WHAT A STORY!

Our church family is quite busy creating memories while helping each other and the community. By sharing our stories, we let others learn about how much fun we have while sharing Christ's love.

Here's my story. I only wish I had some photos to share.

I really enjoy playing card games so when I found out that several Calvary women play Pinochle once a month, I was very excited. I was also a little intimidated since I had no idea how my skills might compare to the rest of the players. I found there were many levels of experience and mine were about average. Everyone was very friendly and there were snacks! I had been playing Pinochle with my husband, aunt and uncle for 25 years so their rules were the only ones I was familiar with. I quickly learned the Calvary ladies have a few minor differences in scoring which actually made the game a bit easier to play. Without realizing it, I ended up sharing a scoring shortcut that my aunt taught me. With Pinochle, each play of the cards can result in zero to four points. When my team wins a hand, I put the cards into one of 5 piles by the number of points in each hand. At the end of the game, I can multiply the number of winning hands by the number of points in each pile then add them together. The idea is to quickly determine how many points (out of 50) each team has. After playing a few hands, one of the other players asked me what I was doing. I wasn't even aware that I was doing something unusual. It was fun to share something new with the group. Sadly, the group hasn't had a chance to get going again since the COVID-19 pandemic eliminated in-person get-togethers. Something to look forward to in the coming months!
