# From the Pastors

### "Change"

""Remember not the former things, nor consider the things of old. Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." (Isaiah 43:18-19).

I have a little bit of a challenge for you today. I would like you to go ahead and pull out a pen or pencil and a piece of paper. I would like you to write your full name 2 or 3 times.

Alright, now I want you to go ahead and switch the pen or pencil to your other hand and write your name 5 times.

So, how did it go? Was it very successful? But more important, how did it feel? Did it feel awkward? Uncomfortable? Slow? Did it make you feel like you wanted to stop reading this newsletter article? Hopefully not.

I once heard it put this way, "If it isn't uncomfortable, it probably isn't change." Change always feels awkward at first but we always start to get better at it the more we practice. Many changes, however, aren't like the activity above in which the request to switch your writing hand might seem a bit arbitrary, and pointlessly difficult. The vast majority of intentional change, however, is meant to move us to a better place or in a better direction. Change is often intended for our good, but many of us see change as something bad. We get into our rhythms and routines, and we don't like to stray. But God is often wanting us to step out of our routines for the very sake of our growth and our good. Growth requires change. Whether it be physical or spiritual growth, change is the natural reality. After all, as John Maxwell once said, "If we are growing, we are always going to be outside of our comfort zone." And so, I ask you today, "Where is God inviting you to grow? Where is God inviting you to change? Where is God inviting you to step out of your comfort zone?"

He is not looking for pointless, arbitrary, or random change. He is not looking to make you suffer through it. Instead, he means it for your good and for the good of others. He is looking at how he is changing and shaping you through the power of the Gospel, the only source of lasting change. The question is this, "Are we willing to be uncomfortable?" May God bless you this week as you ponder these questions, as we commend ourselves to our Heavenly Father, to whom we pray, "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done... Amen."

5. Used orthopedic braces and splints are also accepted.

### **Mission Support**

Through our collective giving the Calvary family supports numerous mission areas both locally and internationally. In the next few monthly newsletters, we will feature stories that describe the impact these ministries are having.

<u>Tamil Indian Mission –</u> Thanks to everyone's generosity as we learned about the Tamil India Mission the weekend of January 15 and 16. Door offering at our worship services totaled approximately \$1,200. These funds will be used to purchase Tamil language Bibles and Hymnals.

<u>Hispanic Lutheran Ministry</u> - In the letter below to Calvary, Pastor Samuel Ruiz discusses the Hispanic Lutheran Ministry. The Hispanic Lutheran Ministry, under the leadership of Pastor Ruiz, works out of Trinity Lutheran Church on the east side of Indianapolis.

For the past few months we have kept working on adding new families through the Food Pantry of Our Shepherd Lutheran Church and the housing ministry at Luterano Indy in Trinity Lutheran Church.

We now have more Cubans, Nicaraguans, Hondurans, Guatemalans, Venezuelans and Mexicans in our Lutheran Ministry. These 2 new ministries have been vital in the growth of our community all because of the help of God and your support and prayers and financial help.

The Latino community of Indianapolis is becoming more aware of the Lutheran doctrine through our ministry. #LuteranoIndy

### Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization (SGO) Gifts Met The Goal

Praise and thanks for the tremendous response to the request for gifts to the Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization (SGO). The generosity of the Calvary family was evident as we nearly doubled the amount of SGO giving in 2021 compared to 2020. The \$129,000 in donations for 2021 scholarship needs met the goal and will allow our school to provide the targeted amount of scholarships.

Student Assistance Fund – The Student Assistance fund provides monetary support for Calvary members studying to become church workers. This year the Advent offerings were designated for this effort. The Student Assistance Fund is currently being used to assist Pastor Sam Troemel and Aaron Levenhagen in their studies.

Note that the Wessler Endowment Fund (discussed in the December newsletter) also provides scholarship support for members studying to be church workers. Disbursements from the Wessler Endowment for students totaled over \$5,700 last year.

# Calvary Lutheran School News from Principal Rensner

### What is the BIGGEST thing that you ever broke??

Is that a difficult question for you to answer? If so you have either broken very few or many things. Having to place a value on the broken item may be part of your dilemma.

Was the item yours or did it belong to someone else? If I break something of mine I ask myself is it worth fixing or replacing. Items which belong to another need to be restored.

Tales of breaking windows and toys are not unusual for most families with children. The Rensner Family of 6 growing up in suburban Chicago was no different. One of the sons, (who will be nameless) actually hit a tennis ball through a neighbor's storm window, inner window, and proceeded to exit knocking off a lamp shade that scratched the adjacent end table. We met the neighbor walking home from the train station to tell her of the damage. We were held accountable for the damages done.

A New Year may bring about thoughts of anticipation. What will 2022 be like? What plans and dates are ahead of us? But a New Year may also bring about regrets. Reflections of 2021 may bring to you thoughts of disappointments, shortfalls, or broken relationships.

Unlike a brand new window pane, relationships are hinged on histories and memories. These are not as easily renewed and restored.

Sin broke the relationship between God and mankind. Enormous break. Instead of holding mankind accountable, God sent His One and Only Son to restore that relationship. It was not as easy as putting in a new window pane. It cost Jesus His life as He suffered and died on Calvary's cross. Through His sacrifice, we have been restored, reconciled, and redeemed. Our account has been paid in full!

2022 is here. Let us walk each day, hour, and minute knowing the saving love of God has made us new. In His grace we have received salvation. We See the Good in the opportunities that He gives to us to share this news with others. We are privileged each day to share this message through the ministry of Calvary Lutheran Church and School.

### Scholarship Grant Fund

We thank and praise God for the gift of love shared by over 32 individuals/ families who contributed \$123,250.00 in 2021 towards our SGO goal of \$125,000. 47 students received scholarship grants and will now be eligible for a Indiana CHOICE voucher for the 2022-23 school year. These gifts also eliminated over \$40,000.00 in waived tuition which is annually budgeted for families unable to fully finance school costs. All donations to this fund receive an Indiana state 50% tax credit. **Please note**: Additional funds were received in January, 2022 enabling us to reach and even exceed our goal by over \$10,000.00. We thank all for their generous hearts and hands contributing to the needs of others. Thank you.

### February 6, 2022 – Fifth Sunday after Epiphany

Psalm 100; Isaiah 6:1-8; Luke 5:1-11 "Like Isaiah" - Sermon Text: Isaiah 6:1-8 - Rev. Dr. Walter Maier III

In Isaiah 6, the chapter describing the call of Isaiah to be a prophet, we see four characteristics God brought forth in the prophet. The good news is that God has given these same characteristics to us.

### February 13, 2022 – Sixth Sunday after the Epiphany

Psalm 1; Jeremiah 17:5-8; Luke 6:17-26 "Blessed" - Sermon Text: Luke 6:20 - Rev. Thomas Eggold

The term "blessed" is one of the most misunderstood and misused words in our cultural vocabulary. Today we find this word "blessed" coming out of the mouth of Jesus...but the way He uses the word stands in blatant contrast to the way it's used in the world. Everything about today's reading challenges our natural and cultural understanding of what it means to be "blessed."
