From the Pastors

Over the past week or so, I've been reading a new book: The Rise and Triumph of the Modern Self, by Carl R. Trueman. It's complex and academic, but it has challenged and expanded my thinking regarding the relationship between our surrounding culture and the Church. I won't even try to summarize it here, but I want to give you a taste of what I've learned, as it has been so rewarding! I think it's especially important as we all make complex choices regarding our faith and life together in the pandemic. (And before you run out and buy it, I should note that Trueman is releasing a lay-level version of the book this month! That book will be called Strange New World: How Thinkers and Activists Redefined Identity and Sparked the Sexual Revolution. Initial reviews are very positive, and I'd be happy to read it with you when it releases. Send me an email if you'd be interested in a class or discussion group on that book.)

Both books are about "self" and "identity." What makes us who we are? What gives our lives meaning? Trueman argues that our answer to these questions has changed, that the "modern self" is wholly different from the "self" of earlier times. For people today, meaning is—forgive the pun—self-determined. People today look inside and make their own meaning. 1000 years ago, however, meaning was primarily discovered outside the self. Meaning was given to us. In case that's still a little too abstract, in our religious context, it has a very concrete application: 1000 years ago, people received their identity primarily from God. Today, however, people typically find their identity by looking inside at their own thoughts and feelings.

Trueman spends hundreds of pages unpacking how this happened and what this means, but in my one-page here, I don't want to do that. I just want you to ask: When Jesus calls me as a disciple, is that just one piece of input about who I am? Or is that the very core of my identity? I suspect that most people in church would give the latter answer, and *rightly*! But think about the impact that it would have if religious people gave the former answer. Think about the clash that would exist between these two worldviews if they coexisted in our society! Trueman argues that this is not hypothetical; it's our society now. And we're only beginning to realize how far-reaching the consequences are for our culture and the Church.

What's the solution to this societal rift? After writing the book, Trueman answered an interviewer this way, "There is no magic bullet or one-size-fits-all [solution] here. But being in church on a Sunday, being part of a worshiping community, is the place where it must start. And having Christian friends to encourage us – and whom we can encourage in turn – to think deeply is vital." I encourage you this month to consider Trueman's encouragement, both for yourself and for your family. How are you making your connection to the Body of Christ central to who you are? Are you a disciple first? A forgiven child of God first? Or something else? This may be the most important question you ever answer.

Mission Investment Story of the Month – Lutheran High School

Through our collective giving the Calvary family supports numerous mission areas both locally and internationally. The Lutheran High School of Indianapolis represents the largest investment made by Calvary in support of ministry beyond our own church and school. Calvary is one of 16 area Lutheran congregations (the "Association Churches") that support the high school.

LHSI was established in 1976 by visionaries who wanted to provide an opportunity for Indianapolis area students to have a quality education in a Christian environment. The school currently serves approximately 220



students including 20 students who are members of Calvary. This school year the Calvary budget includes \$57,000 in funds to support the ministry of Lutheran High School.

Tickets are still available for LuFest, the biggest annual fundraiser for Lutheran High School. LuFest will be held on **Friday April 8** at The Nest in Greenwood. There will be a gift gathering for LuFest auction items at Calvary on March 19 and 20. For more information on LuFest please contact Jake Allen or Julie Pflug.

Watch Worship Services from Home

Share this information by referring your friends and family to clcs.org/videoguide If you cannot attend worship services in person at church, stay connected to Calvary and your Lord and Savior Jesus Christ through our video ministry.

With the live streaming of worship services, you can watch in real-time. All you need to enjoy live streaming is an internet-enabled device:

- 1) A computer or smartphone with the Facebook or YouTube app.
- 2) A computer or smartphone using a web browser displaying the clcs.org/live web page.
- 3) A smart TV that runs YouTube, using the "CLCS Indy" YouTube channel.

Calvary live streams the traditional worship service every Sunday at 8:00 AM, contemporary worship the 2nd & 4th Sundays at 10:45 AM, and midweek and special worship services.

How to watch a live stream on the clcs.org website:

- 1) Open an internet browser like Google Chrome or Microsoft Edge. (You can also watch from your smartphone using Chrome on an Android phone or Safari on an iPhone).
- 2) Type in **clcs.org/live** in the address or search bar then press enter.
- 3) A count-down clock will show when the live stream worship service will begin.



How to watch a live stream on Facebook:

- 1) Open the Facebook app on your phone, computer or tablet.
- 2) Search for "CLCS Indy" and select Calvary Lutheran Church and School.
- 3) Scroll down and click on the Videos tab.

CHOICE Student Scholarship Application Window Opens March 1st



Spring is Coming...Plan Now to Plant!

Raised bed plot **applications** for Calvary's Community Garden are currently available. Applications can be submitted through the church office. Beds are available to plant vegetables and/or flowers and are located off the south parking lot, southwest corner.

Additional compost will be added to the beds in March. If the weather cooperates, our Community Garden should be available April 1st (No Foolint). Cool weather seeds and plants, such as peas, spinach, lettuce, broccoli, etc. may be planted at this time.

The Community Garden is setting aside 2 separate days for WORK DAYS. **Tuesday**, **March 22nd and Saturday**, **March 26th** are designated as days to apply the compost and ready the 15 beds for gardening. Additional work projects may be assigned as we get closer to these dates. WORK DAYS run from 10:00 a.m. until about 1:00 p.m. (or whenever you can come and help).

Individual or family gardeners benefit from planting the beds, but Calvary's Community Garden also benefits several other recipients. Three recipients for this year's Community Garden efforts are Hunger, Inc. (Perry Township), Emmaus Lutheran Food Pantry (Fountain Square) and SENCE Charter School (Indianapolis). **Volunteers** to assist at any time throughout the growing season can contact any members of the Committee.
