From the Pastors

"Sent...with Forgiveness" (2021-22 Ministry Year Theme)

"Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has **sent** me, even so I am **sending** you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld." (John 20:21-23).

As we look to the year ahead, we reflect upon the question, "What kind of church does Jesus want us to be?"

We are "Sent..." - Reflections from the Gospel of John

Sent with a purpose (John 4:34; 5:30; 6:38; 9:4; 14:24)

Sent with forgiveness (John 20:21-23)

Sent into the world (John 17:15-18)

The word "sent" appears repeatedly within the Gospel of John—not only on the lips of the author, but on the lips of Jesus as well. It emphasizes the theme throughout the Gospel and in some ways it comes to a climax here in John 20, as a transition of ministries takes place—the resurrected Jesus prepares to depart to the Father's side and the disciples are now sent in his stead to continue and multiply the ongoing mission of Jesus.

This month we celebrate the great events of not just the Christian Church, but the great events of history as Jesus dies on the cross and raises from the tomb, unleashing a powerful force of restorative hope into the world. The disciples when they emerge from the heartache and hardship of Holy Week will be changed men and women. They will not be the same clumsy and fumbling learners. They will now emerge as a people set on fire by a mission. They boldly step forward to proclaim the message. See the book of Acts! They refuse to step down from confrontations no matter what the costs. See the book of Acts! They give of themselves in radical care, concern, and generosity in a way that the world has hardly ever seen. See the book of Acts!

What has now prepared them for such a bold stance? While some may argue that it is the power of seeing Christ raised from the dead, I might argue it is the overwhelming personal experience of grace that they receive from the resurrected Lord Jesus. They all had abandoned. They all had given up hope. They all had forgotten who they were and who Jesus was to them. They all were crushed by the menacing violence that Jesus received at the hands of so many. And yet, Jesus did not shame them. He did not guilt them. Jesus did not make them grovel in penance and prove themselves obedient. No, Jesus didn't do any of that. He radically welcomed them with a word of peace (see John 20:21). He breathed life and hope and promise into them through the gift of the Spirit (see John 20:22). He entrusted them with perhaps the greatest privilege there can be to carry his very authority to forgive the sins, as we are SENT with this same gift of grace that others may enjoy the same overwhelming personal experience of grace.

We pray for God's Spirit to stir in our hearts and lives this Holy Week. We pray for God's promises to refresh us and equip us this Holy Week. We pray for God's powerful word of commissioning be heard not just "of" the disciples, but heard personally by us as well, for we have the greatest gift there can be, the ability to carry with us the love, forgiveness, and reconciliation of Christ. How does Paul put it?

"Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us.

We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God"

- 2 Corinthians 5:20

Stewardship Update *By Jake Allen, Stewardship Ministry Team Director*

Lenten Offerings are designated for the Student Assistance Fund

The Student Assistance fund provides monetary support for Calvary members studying to become church workers. This year the offerings that are collected in the Lenten envelopes will be used for this purpose. At present, Pastor Sam Troemel and seminary student Aaron Levenhagen are receiving support from this fund.

Thrivent members – Choice Dollars

Many Thrivent members are eligible to receive Choice Dollars. Choice Dollars let eligible member clients choose where Thrivent distributes a portion of its funding each year. Your eligibility is based on insurance premiums and contract values. If you do have Choice Dollars available, please consider designating those dollars for Calvary Lutheran Church & School. Most recently in March, 15 individuals designated \$871 of Choice Dollars to Calvary. Thanks to those who chose Calvary as recipients of these funds.

Also, please remember that **All** Thrivent members are eligible to lead a Thrivent Action Team. Action Team grants in an amount of up to \$250 each are available for many projects at Calvary. Time for Planting

Raised bed plot **applications** for Calvary's Community Garden are currently available. Applications can be submitted through the church office. Beds are available to plant vegetables and/or flowers and are located off the south parking lot, southwest corner. Cost per plot is \$20.00

After new compost is delivered, the Committee will call a **WORK DAY** to spread the compost onto the 15 current raised beds. Cool weather seeds/plants such as peas, spinach, lettuce, broccoli, etc. may be planted at this time. With good weather, such plantings can occur anytime after April 1st.

Individual or family gardeners benefit from planting the beds by enjoying healthy food for the family table. Calvary's Community Garden also benefits several other community recipients. **Three recipients** for this year's Community Garden efforts are Hunger, Inc. (Perry Township), Emmaus Lutheran Food Pantry (Fountain Square) and SENSE Charter School (Indianapolis). These groups receive support from the congregation through the vegetable harvest and donated funds raised through the Community Garden Spring and Fall Flower sales.

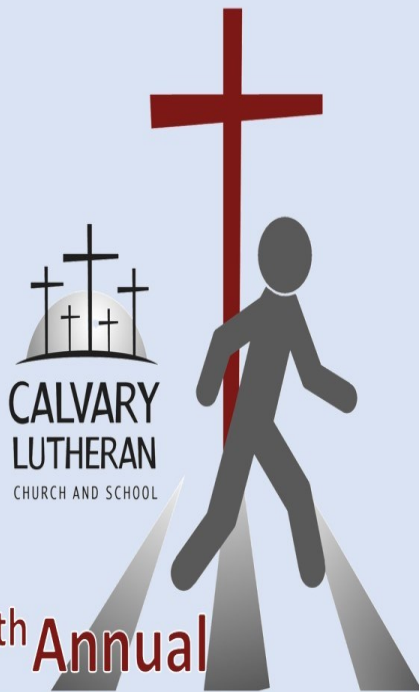

April 3, 2022 – The Fifth Sunday in Lent

Psalm 126; Isaiah 43:16-21; Luke 20:9-20

"Cornerstone of Salvation" - Sermon Text: Luke 20:17b - Rev. Shayne Jonker

"The stone the builders rejected has become the cornerstone." The Messiah of Israel, Jesus, is a rejected Messiah. One the architects and builders of Israel thought unfit to be the cornerstone, but God sizes up the angles differently. This Jesus, born of the Virgin, crucified and risen, reigning at the right hand of God, the One who baptizes you and forgives you and feeds you is the rejected Rock of Israel and the Cornerstone of your salvation.

April 10, 2022 – Sunday of the Passion

Psalm 118:19-29; Philippians 2:5-11; John 12:20-43

"A Troubled Soul" - Sermon Text: John 12:20-43 - Rev. Paul Shoemaker

Jesus faced a horrific death on Calvary's cross. In anticipation of this tortuous, world changing event, Jesus said, "Now is my soul troubled." This troubled soul conquers His fear and fulfills His purpose, the salvation of all.

April 17, 2022 – Easter Sunday

Psalm 16; Isaiah 65:17-25; Luke 24:1-12

"Created New from Empty" - Sermon Text: Isaiah 65:17-25 - Rev. William Mueller

Easter Sunday – what a day to celebrate! Jesus is risen from the dead! Jesus lives, no more to die! But Easter is far, far more than just a day to celebrate. It is a movement and activity of God to be lived every day! We discover more about this in the prophecy of Isaiah. Through Jesus Christ and His resurrection we have something new from something empty!

April 24, 2022 – Second Sunday of Easter

Psalm 148; Revelation 1:4-18; John 20:19-31

"Jesus Enters Locked Doors" - Sermon Text: John 20:19, 36 - Rev. Dr. Thomas Ahlersmeyer

What are the "locked doors" of your life – a chronic physical ailment, a broken relationship, a dead-end job, or whatever else seemingly holds you captive?
