### From the Pastors

Ever since Holy Week, I've had a question rumbling around in my head, which I just can't shake. What's the relationship between Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday? Not just historically—I know they are all in a row—but the sermons and themes we meditate on during those three days. Now, I know that it's probably been a while for you, and I'm being very vague. So whether you were there or not, let me briefly recap what we discussed.

On Maundy Thursday, we heard about the importance of loving one another, especially for our fellowship at the Lord's Table. To receive the Lord's Supper isn't like going to a restaurant and eating alone, but eating at a family table. But all too often, we ignore the people around us!

On Good Friday, we meditated upon Jesus' death for us, and the fact that it brings us forgiveness. We may struggle to forgive others, we may struggle to resist temptation. But on Good Friday, Jesus pours himself out for us anyway.

On Easter Sunday, we heard about "resurrection faith," the kind of faith which looks not just toward the personal forgiveness won on Good Friday, but to the Easter hope of a new body and a transformed, new life in Jesus' coming kingdom.

So! What's the relationship between these three days? Are they related? Or are they completely separate ideas? It's probably apparent that my answer is going to be yes, they are related, but why? My answer comes from 1 John 1.

"God is light, and in him is no darkness at all. If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth. But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. (1 John 1:5b-7)"

There's a lot more that could be said, but in short, John connects our understanding of the Gospel to our love for our brothers and sisters and our forgiveness. To put it in the terms that we started with: Maundy Thursday and Good Friday only make sense—they only find their fullest meaning—on Easter Sunday! Conversely, Easter Sunday only makes sense when we live in both the Maundy Thursday and the Good Friday reality!

The forgiveness of Good Friday—"the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin"—emerges from walking "in the light" and our "fellowship with one another." Why? Because "God is light." As John will say later in this same letter, "God is love!" The new life of Easter Sunday is a forgiven and loving life, because we are not just forgiven in Christ, but commanded to forgive as he forgave and love as he loved. The love of Maundy Thursday only makes sense in the light of the love shone on the cross of Good Friday. This is the completely new life we have in Jesus due to the promise of a future resurrection, just like Jesus' on Easter Sunday!

# Stewardship Emphasis

### Stewardship Update By Jake Allen, Stewardship Ministry Team Director

#### Christ Lutheran Ministry for the Deaf

Christ Lutheran in Irvington is in the process of becoming the host church for the Indianapolis area Ministry for the Deaf. This ministry has been housed at Peace Deaf Lutheran, but the Peace facility is being sold and the deaf ministry is transitioning to Christ Lutheran. Christ Lutheran will call a Deaconess Intern trained in ASL this spring to assist in serving the deaf community. The Stewardship Ministry Team has decided to allocate a portion of the Third Quarter Mission envelopes to Christ Lutheran to support this vital local ministry.

#### **Giving Statements**

Giving statements for the first quarter of the year have been printed and placed in members mailboxes. Thank you to Dennis Sherfy for his continuing faithful service for many years as Financial Secretary.

#### Calvary Gift Gathering for LuFest and LuFest Results

The Calvary Gift Gathering yielded numerous auction items and approximately \$420 in cash. These funds were used to purchase a TV and additional items for the auction. Thanks to everyone who contributed to the Gift Gathering and/or directly to LuFest. LuFest was very successful this year with over \$125,000 raised. The special appeal for a new lighted sign (similar to Calvary's new sign) was successful with approximately \$60,000 raised.

#### <u> Ukrainian Refugee Assistance – Synod Response To Date</u>

As the situation in Ukraine continues, the church prays for peace and for those in harm's way. We also are concerned about how to provide for those affected.

The Office of International Mission of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod is working with several Lutheran church bodies and missionaries in Europe to help our brothers and sisters in Christ in the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Ukraine, Lutheran refugees and others affected by the violence. In summary the Synod's response to date is as follows:

- More than \$45,000 has been dispatched to a congregation in Odesa, Ukraine, that is affiliated with our German Lutheran partner church body (SELK). That funding has been used to aid refugees in Lviv, Lutskfor, Vinnysia, eastern parts of Ukraine and other locales. The assistance has been used primarily for food, medicine, travel accommodations, documents and clothes. We are positioned to provide ongoing similar grants to Ukraine upon request.
- As Lutheran pastors in Ukraine have pivoted from the "everyday functions" of the ministry, to providing spiritual care to a war-torn people, your Synod is using charitable donations to compensate these under-shepherds for meeting critical spiritual needs of their communities.
- Nearly \$68,000 has been dispatched to Lutheran churches outside of Ukraine, in Latvia, Lithuania and Romania. These funds have been used for food, housing, transportation, medicine and items for personal hygiene and care for displaced persons. These funds are also being used to help transport fleeing Ukrainians across the border and provide spiritual and pastoral care in places like Riga, Saldus and other towns. We are also about to send funds to Slovakia for use at a primary (K-8) Lutheran school taking in refugees.
- Your Synod is collaborating with SELK to support and increase the church's capacity to serve displaced peoples by providing spiritual care and physical aid to those seeking safety and shelter in Germany.
