From the Pastors

Continue...

*"But as for you, **continue** in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it" (2 Timothy 3:14).*

It is nearly the start of a new school year. It is a time of change in schedule and return to routine. This time of year brings all sorts of new "beginnings" and yet it brings all sorts of opportunities to build upon what has come before. I love how the Apostle Paul connects these two realities in his letter to the younger pastor Timothy. Timothy after all will soon be entering a "new" chapter in his ministry. Paul will no longer be with him as he has in the past. Paul also will not be there to give him the direction, leadership, and guidance that he once did. Yet, in the midst of this new challenge, Paul provides Timothy both the remembrance and the encouragement he needs as he launches into a new season of life.

First, Paul reminds Timothy of the strong foundation upon which his faith has been grounded. Timothy's faith has been built brick by brick upon the foundation of Jesus Christ. The builders have been more than passing strangers. Instead, they have been those that he has known and trusted. His mother and grandmother have lovingly placed the word of God in his heart and mind. Paul himself has painstakingly raised up Timothy along the way. In the midst of a shaky and tumultuous world, Timothy is able to have a rock-solid faith because he knows "from whom he has learned it." There have been others who have given him the gift of Jesus, the one reliable source of stability in a world of so many conflicting claims. Where do you see those faithful fellow believers at work in your life? Where might you find more who would come alongside you in this journey of faith? Where are you being called to provide that steady influence into the lives of other Christians, especially those younger in the faith?

Second, Paul gives Timothy the needed encouragement for this new chapter in life, as he urges Timothy to "continue." There are many things that we "start" in our lives. We start various diets, exercise plans, personal goals, etc., but how well do we do at "continuing" what we have started? And yet we know that the ability to "continue" often comes from the momentum that is keeping us moving forward. Paul invites Timothy to look back as he sees how far he has come. He encourages Timothy to consider what he has learned, experienced, and believed for that is the key as he "continues" in what God has in store for his life. Where is God inviting you to celebrate your past that it might prepare you for the future? Where is God encouraging you to learn from your experiences that it might propel you in your ongoing journey? Where is God challenging you to continue steadfast in your faith?

As we ourselves find ourselves at a time of transition into a "new chapter" may you continue in what you have firmly believed because of those from whom you have learned it. May your experience of growth in the past prepare you for your continued growth in the present. For each and every day that we "continue" this journey of faith, we remember that we do not journey alone, for as Paul says elsewhere, "And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ" (Philippians 1:6). May you continue to apply the good news of God's gospel grace in Jesus Christ to your life each and every day.


Lutheran World Relief Promise Project—School Kits

SGO Information

Too Good To Be True?!

God has provided a unique opportunity to help fund the Christian education of our Calvary students. The Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization of Indiana has been identified as a new Scholarship Granting Organization. Scholarships through private and corporate donations are granted to Calvary student families whose income is less than 300% of the Federal free or reduced hot lunch guidelines.

How may I help?

Donations are currently being accepted. We are in need of \$55,500.00 to fully fund these grants.

Multiple Benefits for Calvary Lutheran School students, the private or corporate donor, and Calvary Lutheran Church

1. Students and their families accepted in this program will receive a scholarship grant per child enrolled in Kindergarten -8th grade at Calvary.
2. The donor will receive a 50% Indiana State tax credit for every dollar donated. Example: A donation of \$1000.00 will result in a tax credit of \$500.00 towards your Indiana income tax liability. Private as well as corporate donations will receive this benefit.
3. The \$55,500.00 received will eliminate the amount of money granted to our students and their families through our own budgeted funds.

Where Do I sign up?

Donor forms are available online at www.LutheranSGO.org. Be sure to mark **CALVARY LUTHERAN SCHOOL** as the recipient of your donation.

How Do I Proceed?

Return the completed donor form along with your donation to the School Office or directly to the Lutheran SGO of Indiana by December 31, 2021. The Lutheran SGO of Indiana will issue your tax credit statement for your 2021 tax filing.

What happens in the future?

Children receiving a scholarship grant are eligible the following school year to convert this grant to an Indiana CHOICE SCHOLARSHIP. This again significantly reduces the need for congregational funded scholarship dollars.

Children will have the opportunity to hear God's Word each day through your giving. God continues to open doors to others once thought closed due to financial needs. Your assistance in this program is so greatly appreciated!

Have you participated in the SGO donation?

Over 65 families have participated in this process by donating nearly \$700,000.00 during the past ten years. We are asking those past donors to enlist two other families to become involved in this "Too Good to be True" adventure. By donating in the past you are fully aware of the unique benefits this SGO provides. Please help by talking to at least two other families and enlist their participation as well.



August 7, 2022 – Ninth Sunday after Pentecost

Psalm 33:12-22; Hebrews 11:1-16; Psalm 33:12-22

"Anxious Hearts" - Sermon Text: Luke 12:34 - Rev. Shayne Jonker

"For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." If your stuff is what you treasure, your heart will be devoted to these things and become your gods. Thus our Lord graciously directs us away from our idols to Himself. For He alone is reliable and can deliver us from anxiety and fear.

August 14, 2022 – Tenth Sunday after Pentecost

Psalm 103:1-13; Hebrews 11:17-31; 12:1-3; Luke 12:9-53
