From the Pastors Here for a Purpose

Why are we here?

This isn't simply a question that a forgetful person asks when entering a room for something. This is a question of intention and purpose. Life has a way of sweeping us up with the "who" and the "what" and the "when" and the "where." Too often though we don't slow down to contemplate the "why." Too often we are so busy "doing" that we forget to ask questions about our deeper "being."

So, why are we, Calvary Lutheran Church & School, here? What is God's intention and purpose for placing us here?

- 1) We are here to grow in our faith.
- 2) We are here to grow in our service.
- 3) We are here for the sake of our community!

Many times we clearly remember reasons #1 and #2, but there are times that we can forget #3. We are here not simply for those who are a part of our church or school. We are here for the good of our wider community. The church is to be a "light in the darkness" and a "city set on a hill." We are called to something greater because God is greater than this world. He created us with intention, purpose, and with a mission in mind.

If we then have this calling, we cannot half-heartedly pursue it. When it comes to our service to the Lord, I don't think we can declare that we did the job "good enough." God both desires and deserves our best. And so as a church of the Reformation, we are always committing ourselves to live in line with the Scriptures, especially as they call us to... ²⁴ consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, ²⁵ not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another..." (Hebrews 10:24-25a).

It is for these reasons that we are in the midst of two important sermon and study series within our congregation. We have already started our "For the Sake of Others" series based upon our ministry year theme. But we also will soon launch our congregational study, "The Being Challenge," as we contemplate our relationship with God. Each of these series go to the core of who we are and what we are to be about. We are not simply a service organization seeking to "do good," for we have the life-changing good news of the Gospel that comes along with every act of love that we share with our community and world. Nor are we simply a place that people come to worship and learn, for we are sent with specific callings and vocations as we carry the good news of Christ with us in our everyday lives.

May God bless our church and its unity as we live together in his mission and as we serve, "For the Sake of Others."

May God open your eyes to his calling in your life.

From Your Executive Director

Happy Reformation!

It seems we were just celebrating the 500th anniversary of Luther's posting of the 95 Theses in Wittenberg, Germany – but already five years have passed since that centennial event. How time flies! If we look back to 2017, it almost seems ancient: no COVID-19, no lockdowns, and a robust economy with little inflation. One significant issue that year was the horrible hurricane season the southeast experienced, including Hurricane Maria which caused massive devastation to Puerto Rico, Saint Croix, and Dominica.

In 2017, would any of us have guessed what the next five years would bring?

Yet here we are, five years later, celebrating another anniversary of the Reformation, another year to give thanks for Luther, Melanchthon, and the others who dared to look the Rome church squarely in the face and declare that reform was needed. It wasn't an easy struggle, but one that put lives and reputations at stake, all in the name of change.

The Swiss Calvinist theologian Karl Barth popularized the phrase "Ecclesia semper reformanda est" ("the church must always be reformed") in 1947, 430 years after the first salvo of the Reformation battle took place in Wittenberg. And while we do not agree with the Calvinist dogma to which Barth preached, we can find common ground with his statement.

Look at how the Lutheran church, and Calvary, has changed. From the beginning of the LCMS in Missouri in 1847 when services were conducted in German, to the first German-Lutheran churches in Indianapolis (notably St. Paul's and St. John's), to Calvary's humble beginnings in the depth of the Great Depression, and today a major LCMS congregation in Central Indiana. Can you imagine what our forefathers, who left Saxony for religious freedom, would think about worship life at Calvary in 2022 – which includes live/streaming services to those unable to physically join us on Sundays?

So much has changed in the past five years, much less the last 505 years. And changes will continue to take place: our community is changing, our neighborhoods are changing, and certainly the world around us is changing.

The good news is no matter how much things around us change, Calvary's mission will not change: to Engage People In Christ! How this is done will probably look different in the future, just as how the things we do today are different to the way our ancestors celebrated and worshipped – but thank God that no matter how these things change, our message, like our mission, is unchanged. As Lutheran Hour speaker (1955 – 1988) Rev. Oswald Hoffmann used to say, we preach Christ crucified. Or as the author writes in Hebrews 13:8, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever." (ESV)

Thanks be to God that the message of the Reformation still resounds today!

Scholarship Tax Credit Information

"Too Good to Be True?!"

God has provided a unique opportunity to help fund the Christian education of our Calvary students. The Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization of Indiana, Inc. has been identified as a Scholarship Granting Organization. Scholarships through private and corporate donations are granted to Calvary student families whose income is less than 300% of the Federal free or reduced hot lunch guidelines.

Updates from the 2021-2022 School Year:

- 28 families/individuals contributed over \$125,000.00 towards this Scholarship Tax Credit
- This funded the need for 52 Scholarship grants.
- Many grant recipients are now enjoying the benefit of a CHOICE State voucher.
- All Calvary Lutheran Church and School student aid from the General Fund has been eliminated.

New Information

- Nearly \$700,000.00 has been gathered through the state tax credit initiative over the past 10 years.
- The donor base has been virtually unchanged over these years.
- Donors are increasing their gifts. Why? The "Too Good to be True" aspects
- We are asking for previous year participants in this program to communicate all the benefits inviting two-three others to prayerfully consider involvement increasing our donor base.
- Personal tax credits that remain against your tax liability may be used for up to 9 years.
- All is to now be accomplished online. www.lutheranSGO.org
- Be sure to identify **Calvary Lutheran School**, **Indianapolis** as the recipient of your donation.

How may I help?

Donations are currently being accepted. We are in need of <u>\$85,000.00</u> to fully fund this year's grants. Please prayerfully consider your involvement and support in this most worthwhile program. **Urgency-**

With the change in household income levels other schools are granting SGO's as well to give their students a track to a CHOICE scholarship. Only \$18.5 million in tax credits are available during the state fiscal year. Please make your donation prior to October 31 to ensure your Indiana state tax credit.

Multiple Benefits for Calvary Lutheran School students, the private or corporate donor, and Calvary Lutheran Church

- 1. Students and their families accepted in this program will receive a scholarship grant per child enrolled in kindergarten-8th grade at Calvary.
- The donor will receive a 50% Indiana State tax credit for every dollar donated. Example: A donation of \$1000.00 will result in a tax credit of \$500.00 towards your Indiana income tax liability. Private as well as corporate donations will receive this benefit.
- 3. A student receiving a Scholarship grant in kindergarten will then be eligible for a CHOICE State voucher through 12th grade. This could result in a total of over \$80,000.00 towards Christian Education.

What happens in the future?

Children receiving a scholarship grant are eligible the following school year to convert this grant to a CHOICE State voucher. This again has eliminated the need for congregational funded scholarship dollars. Children will have the opportunity to hear God's Word through your giving. God continues to open doors to others once thought closed due to financial needs. Your assistance in this program is so greatly appreciated!
