From the Pastors

As I write this, we in the church office are getting ready to launch the 2022 Congregational Study, Being Challenge. But as you read this, we will be well underway. So I wonder: Did you join a small group? How's it going? Did you grab a book for private study? How's that going? Have you missed a day of those devotions? Five days? Have you even opened the book? Or are you only engaging with the study through the weekly sermons? I don't know your answer to these questions, but I pray that this endeavor—the study, small groups, and sermon series—has been rewarding for you, however much or however little you have participated.

We chose this study because it fit well with our theme for the year, "For the sake of others," though perhaps in a counterintuitive way. As Christians, we all want to serve as we have been served; we all want to love as we have been loved, to forgive as we have been forgiven. But we can only serve others well when we are deeply rooted in good spiritual habits. Why? Because we need to know love to love others. We need to know forgiveness to forgive others. We need to know the service of Jesus to serve others like Jesus. "Put your oxygen mask on first before you help the person next to you," right? We chose this study because we want to make sure that every member of Calvary has a deep wellspring to draw from when they go out the door. Whoever you meet, we want you prepared to share Jesus.

So how is the study going? How are you immersing yourself in Jesus? Has the study invigorated your prayer life? Your Bible study? Your connection to your church family? If your answer to any of these questions is uncertain, that's appropriate! Habits don't change overnight, so don't be surprised if the changes are slow. And don't be surprised if you encounter resistance. The devil doesn't want you to be rooted in the word of God. He doesn't want you praying. He'll do whatever he can to convince you that your church family isn't worth your time.

But know that these habits are worth it, for if we neglect these spiritual habits, we do so to the detriment of ourselves and to the detriment of our witness to others. So please know that if you're behind, it's never too late to catch up, so go read what you missed. If that's too daunting, just skip the days you missed and read only today's devotion. Better to aim for 40 days of exercise and only do five than to never exercise at all. Better to do one day of exercise than none at all.

Please join me in praying for the people of our congregation, both those who are participating and those who are not, whatever their reason. And God bless you in *your study*.

Executive Director

From Your Executive Director

This month we celebrate Thanksgiving, the oldest secular holiday in the United States. From the celebration of the harvest in 1621 between Plymouth colonists and the Wampanoag tribe, to Washington's proclamation in 1789 of a day of national thanksgiving, to Lincoln's proclamation in 1863 of the last Thursday of November as our national day of thanksgiving (now the fourth Thursday of November since 1941), this holiday is one of lasting tradition in our country. Our congregation has much for which to be thankful, so much that enumerating our blessings is impossible. We have a debt-free facility, we have Sprit-led pastors, committed staff, and strong lay leadership. While we are still struggling to return to "normal" following the COVID pandemic, Calvary is truly blessed as Christ's church.

But what about those outside our church in our community? Our neighbors? If we use the 46227 Zip Code as a defining area, our neighbors are struggling, according to recent Census data:

- 16% of our neighbors live below the poverty line, compared with an average of 11.6% in Central Indiana and 12.9% in Indiana. Those with households having children under 18 years of age is worse: 23%.
- Both per capita income of \$25,359 and median household income of \$44,873 are below both Central Indiana and Indiana averages, by as much as 33%.
- Less than 83% hold a high school degree compared to a state and local average of 90%, and only 21% hold an advanced (bachelor's, master's) degree. The Central Indiana average is 36%.
- 17.8% of our neighbors were not born here but have come to the United States in hope of a better life. Statewide, this is only 5.3%.
- 1% of our housing units lace complete plumbing facilities, and 2.7% lack kitchen facilities.
- Almost 13% of the households have children with no father present a 43% increase over the past ten years.

In the parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37, ESV) Jesus was asked by a lawyer what needed done to have eternal life. Jesus responded ""What is written in the Law? How do you read it?" And he (the lawyer) answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." And he (Jesus) said to him, "You have answered correctly; do this, and you will live." But the lawyer wasn't content to leave it at that, asking Jesus "And who is my neighbor?" to which we receive the parable. And the clarification that the neighbor was the one showing mercy to the victim of the robbers.

Our neighbors are all around us. It's that mom at the grocery store trying to determine how to pay for her groceries. It's the older couple deciding which medicine they need to skip this month due to the cost. It's the immigrant family who looks different than us, isn't fluent in English, and is treated with contempt. It's the worker who had his or her job eliminated and can't find a new one because of training and/or education.

So, this Thanksgiving, by all means let's give thanks for the many blessings God has given us, so many that they cannot be counted or listed – but at the same time, let's also look to how we can share those blessings with our neighbors, bringing them the good news of the Gospel: Engaging People In Christ. And while we're at it, let's look at how we might in other ways share our blessings, to help our neighbors so they too have reason to give thanks and praise God, just as we do. Thanks be to God!

Think back to a time when you lovingly pursued another or were pursued. No, not stalking, but the beginnings of a deep, loving relationship when every waking thought and breath turned to that person. Your steps were lighter and your days so much brighter. What did you do to help develop and grow that relationship or what did you experience as one pursued or was it equally manifested? Cards, notes, text messages, phone calls, time together, gifts, dates, attention, surprises, and communications all consumed your heart and mind to share your love. Your first thought turned to that person's needs and wants.

As the relationship continued to grow and became more stable and permanent did that level of pursuing continue? Once we have something we tend to be contented. Why pursue something that you already have? We may even take the loving relationship that has been established for granted. To actively pursue is no longer at the core of our being. We may even miss an anniversary or Valentine's Day. Hopefully, the relationship has not simply grown comfortable. If all pursuing ceases the relationship continues to grow stagnant.

The same can be said about our relationship with God. God has initiated the pursuing. He sends to us the Holy Spirit 24/7. God is constantly in pursuit of us. He gives to us His Word and Sacraments. He is ready to hear our prayers. He wants our entire being. Salvation is granted through Jesus. God tells us that He is a jealous God. We may at times take this relationship for granted. We may see God as our spare tire and not our steering wheel.

God desires for us to pursue Him as well. To spend time with Him, to first seek His kingdom, to knock at His door, to gather with fellow believes and study His Word are ways for us to know God more fully. Just like a relationship takes time and commitment to grow, so too for our faith to grow, we must develop this relationship with God our heavenly Father through the power of the Holy Spirit. If we neglect His Word and the preaching of it our relationship with God may grow stagnant. No longer does our every waking thought and breath turn to our God. We may grow distant. We are all Part of His Story. We thank and praise God for His continued pursuit of us. We know that He will never give up. We pray for His Spirit to refresh us each day in our pursuit of God. This relationship is eternal.

Opening Doors

God has blessed families of Indiana with the choice of sending their children to the school that they feel best meets their needs. The LUTHERAN SGO of Indiana has changed the boundaries of the local school and greatly broadened them. You can open even more doors allowing students to enter the hallways of Calvary Lutheran Church and School. This opportunity will provide scholarship grants to students and their families. Contributions made by you for this purpose will be used to offer a Christian education so that children may not only receive a quality education, but to hear God's Word.

How do I help open these doors? Contribution forms for Lutheran SGO are available in online at www.LutheranSGO.org. The state of Indiana will give to you a tax credit of 50% of your donation. Example: If you give a gift of \$1000.00 you will receive an Indiana state tax credit of \$500.00. This is a unique opportunity. Funding for these scholarship grants for current students enrolled at Calvary is \$82,500.00. We have currently gathered approximately \$24,000.00. Those desiring to contribute to this fund may do so through December 31 to receive the tax credit for this 2022 calendar year. Even better still, students under a Scholarship Granting Organization are eligible for a CHOICE Indiana state voucher the following school year. Any additional funds gathered will remain in our account with the Lutheran SGO of Indiana to be used during the 2023-24 school year.

We ask the Lord to provide for the needs of others through the gifts of our hands.


