From the Pastors

United in Mission

"4There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call—5 one Lord, one faith, one baptism, 6 one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all. 7 But grace was given to each one of us according to the measure of Christ's gift." ... "11 [Jesus] gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, 12 to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, 13 until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ, 14 so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes. 15 Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, 16 from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every joint with which it is equipped, when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love. (Ephesians 4:4-7, 11-16).

I love how the Apostle Paul is able to hold the truths of Scripture in such beautiful tension. So often we feel life trying to pull us in one direction or the other. So often we hear of the polarization taking place within our society today. Paul doesn't want us veering one direction or the other. Instead, Paul yearns that we might live in the sweet spot of God's beautiful will for his church. In Ephesians 4, he celebrates many different tensions that are at the heart of our identity as the church. Here are just a few of these beautiful tensions to consider:

- 1) First, there is the unity and the diversity within the church (4:4-7). There are many different gifts, skills, desires, and backgrounds of the people of God and yet we are graciously united through our one and only Savior, Jesus Christ. None of us are more saved or less saved than others. We all stand as recipients of "grace [that] was given to each one of us according to the measure of Christ's gift" (4:7). And it is through that grace and salvation that we are united also in our mission to those outside the church. We are united in our calling to be a light to the world.
- 2) Second, there is the unique callings for both the leaders and the people of the church. We are all equally called to our unique roles and places within God's kingdom, but we are also all a part of the same team, working to build one another up and to build up the body of Christ. The pastors and teachers of the church equip the saints (4:11), so that they in turn may build up the body. It is a mutual mission and a collective calling. We are all in this working together.
- 3) Third, there is the reality of the now and the not yet. Paul uses several images of growth and maturity to express the truth that we are not yet who God will shape us to be. The tension then is that we are just as loved and just as saved today as we will ever be, but we have not yet grown to be the saints that we will become. We celebrate all that God has done for us in our past and present. He alone deserves all glory and praise for the gift of salvation that is ours now to enjoy. But he is not yet finished in fulfilling his promised work among us. He gives us a promise of a future that is drawing nearer each and every day.
- 4) Fourth, there is the tension between being firm and steady and yet also growing and in motion. Paul uses first an image of a storm on the sea to describe our stability on God's Word of promise. Though the waves might threaten to toss us here and there, we find ourselves deeply anchored in the rock-solid confession of Jesus Christ (4:13-14). And yet he goes on to use and image of a growing body in motion that is ever changing and becoming who God wants it to be (4:15-17).

May God continue to guide us as Calvary Lutheran Church and School, as we seek to live out these beautiful tensions within our lives together. May we be equally committed and connected to that mission of "Engaging People in Christ," as we celebrate all of God's gifts and benefits to us, as well as all the opportunities that we have to reach out in service to others.

May God bless our Advent and Christmas opportunities to connect with our community, as well as new opportunities for us to serve our church, our school, and our community in the year ahead.

From Your Executive Director

"Ding-Dong"

"Who is it?"

"A visitor."

"Oh."

If this happens at your home, what do you do? If it's a friend, do you invite them in? If it's a stranger, do you invite them in? If it's someone bearing a badge of authority – i.e., a police officer – do you invite them in? If it's one of our pastors, do you invite him in?

And if you invite them in, what's your next step? Worry about the clutter in the house? Is the house clean? Is the dog barking at them? Are there things sitting about that you might be embarrassed or worried for the visitor to see? ("Oh, just ignore those empty beer bottles.") Are these people you want in your house, or do you confine them to the foyer? How do you handle guests and visitors to your home? Do you welcome them, or treat them as interruptions and annoyances to your routine? Those darn visitors.

News flash: your residence is not your only home. Your church, Calvary, is your home as well.

We have been talking at Calvary about our neighbors and our guests. How do we welcome them? Do we eagerly greet them and make them feel welcome, or are we more concerned they might sit in our normal chair/pew? Or might they dress, speak, or look differently than others in our congregation, and we treat them as "Außenseiter" as our Lutheran German ancestors treated those not of German origin?

Hezekiah was the king of Israel/Judah and reigned from about 721-687 BC. He was from the house of David and succeeded his father King Ahaz, who by all accounts was an ungodly man. His mother was Abijah, daughter of the prophet Zechariah, and his name means "God has strengthened." We read of his life not only in 2 Kings, but also in 2 Chronicles, specifically in chapter 29:3 where it is recorded "In the first year of his reign, in the first month, he opened the doors of the house of the Lord and repaired them," restoring worship in the Temple.

At Calvary, we have some work to do. We need to open our doors like Hezekiah and be like the men of whom Jesus spoke in Luke 12:36: ".... so that they may open the door to him (their master) at once when he comes and knocks." We need to throw our doors open, welcome our guests, exposing them to the Light of the World whose birth we celebrate this Christmas. These are the very people we sing about in our hymn #748, our strangers here!

This Advent and Christmas season, look for our visitors and guests. Get out of your comfort zone and greet them. Get to know them. Let them experience the warmth, kindness, and graciousness we all experience at our church home, and most importantly, engage them as we constantly work to Engage People In Christ at Calvary!

The Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization of Indiana has been identified as a Scholarship Granting Organization. Scholarships through private and corporate donations are granted to Calvary student families whose income is less than 300% of the Federal free or reduced hot lunch guidelines.

Multiple Benefits for Calvary Lutheran School students, the private or corporate donor, and Calvary Lutheran Church

- 1. Students and their families accepted in this program will receive a scholarship grant per child enrolled in Kindergarten -8th grade at Calvary.
- 2. The donor will receive a 50% Indiana State tax credit for every dollar donated. Example: A donation of \$1000.00 will result in a tax credit of \$500.00 towards your Indiana income tax liability. Private as well as corporate donations will receive this benefit. A Federal charitable deduction may also be realized.

Children receiving a scholarship grant are eligible the following school year to convert this grant to an Indiana State CHOICE voucher. This again significantly reduces the need for congregational funded scholarship dollars.
