- Receiving a letter from someone was a big deal.
- Paul's letters were probably heard, not read.
- Colossians' opening has a fairly normal structure.
- Colossians begins with a really big run-on sentence.

- Recipients
- Greetings and blessing
- Thanksgiving
- Prayer for the reader

2. Body

- Instruction in Doctrine
- Instruction in Practice
- Response to the "other side"
- Call to repentance
- Travel Plans

Thanksgiving Colossians 1:3-8

³ We always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, when we pray for you, ⁴ since we heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love that you have for all the saints, ⁵ because of the hope laid up for you in heaven, of which you have heard before in the word of the truth, the gospel, ⁶ which has come to you, as indeed in the whole world it is bearing fruit and increasing—as it also does among you, since the day you heard it and understood the grace of God in truth, ⁷ just as you learned it from Epaphras our beloved fellow servant, who is a faithful minister of Christ on your behalf ⁸ and who has made known to us your love in the Spirit.
