Bad Uses of the Tongue: Speaking Evil & Boasting

An Interlude James 4:11-12

¹¹ Do not speak evil against one another, brothers. The one who speaks against a brother or judges his brother, speaks evil against the law and judges the law.

¹⁹ ...let every person be quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to anger; ²⁰ for the anger of man does not produce the righteousness of God. (James 1)

An Interlude James 4:11–12

But if you judge the law, you are not a doer of the law but a judge. ¹² There is only one lawgiver and judge, he who is able to save and to destroy.

But if you judge the law, you are not a doer of the law but a judge. ¹² There is only one lawgiver and judge, he who is able to save and to destroy.

But who are you to judge your neighbor?

¹⁰ Whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become guilty of all of it. ¹¹ ... If you do not commit adultery but do murder, you have become a transgressor of the law. (James 2)

¹³ Come now, you who say, "Today or tomorrow we will go into such and such a town and spend a year there and trade and make a profit"—¹⁴ yet you do not know what tomorrow will bring. Or Psalm 39: "Behold, you have made my days a few handbreadths, and my lifetime is as nothing before you. Surely all mankind stands as a mere breath!"

But it might also be Psalm 144: "Man is like a breath; his days are like a passing shadow."

This may be a reference to Ecclesiastes 1: "Vanity, vanity... all is vanity!" In Hebrew, the word "vanity" also means "mist" or "vapor," so this can be read"Vapor, vapor... all is vapor!"

How often do I use this phrase? James 4:13–17

Boasting? I call this "planning!" James 4:13–17

So = Therefore James 4:13–17

For you are a mist that appears for a little time and then vanishes. ¹⁵ Instead you ought to say, "If the Lord wills, we will live and do this or that." ¹⁶ As it is, you boast in your arrogance. All such boasting is evil. ¹⁷ So whoever knows the right thing to do and fails to do it, for him it is sin.

This "So" is from a Greek word meaning, "therefore."

To plan without considering the Lord is sin.

All our plans should include the Lord.

All our plans should be shaped by the Lord.

All our plans should depend on the Lord.

¹² Blessed is the man who remains steadfast under trial, for when he has stood the test he will receive the crown of life, which God has promised to those who love him. ¹³ Let no one say when he is tempted, "I am being tempted by God," for God cannot be tempted with evil, and he himself tempts no one. ¹⁴ But each person is tempted when he is lured and enticed by his own desire. ¹⁵ Then desire when it has conceived gives birth to sin, and sin when it is fully grown brings forth death.

²³ For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man who looks intently at his natural face in a mirror.
²⁴ For he looks at himself and goes away and at once forgets what he was like.
²⁵ But the one who looks into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and perseveres, being no hearer who forgets but a doer who acts, he will be blessed in his doing.

Think on all that we've discussed as we read back through portions of James 1/2 ⁸ If you really fulfill the royal law according to the Scripture, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself," you are doing well.⁹ But if you show partiality, you are committing sin and are convicted by the law as transgressors.¹⁰ For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become guilty of all of it.¹¹ For he who said, "Do not commit adultery," also said, "Do not murder." If you do not commit adultery but do murder, you have become a transgressor of the law.¹² So speak and so act as those who are to be judged under the law of liberty. ¹³ For judgment is without mercy to one who has shown no mercy. Mercy triumphs over judgment.
