

From the Pastors

Our 2019-20 Ministry Year Theme is "Everyday Blessings." This year, we hope to take inspiration from the example of the early followers of Jesus, following the helpful acronym, **BLESS**. Each month, our newsletter will look at a different letter of this acronym to see how it might help guide our life together in the 21st century.

B - Begin with prayer. L - Listen. E - Eat. S - Serve. S - Share.

This month's focus is:

S - Share.

¹⁴ How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching? ¹⁵ And how are they to preach unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news!" - Romans 10:14-15

How have you been doing? Have you practiced this year's ministry year theme yet? It's not too late to start now. Invite that coworker over for dinner. Invite your neighbor out to lunch. If you've already started this process, let this newsletter serve as encouragement.

Let me first encourage you not to see **S**hare as the scary part of our ministry year theme, nor as an effort to push agendas. Don't treat this as a cold-call knock on someone's door; focus first on loving the person in front of you. Pray for them. Listen to them. Eat with them. Serve them. Let's not be known for our ulterior motives, but by our *love*.

The sharing should come naturally. It's not so much, "if you died tonight, do you know where you'd go..." but rather, "I went through something similar a couple years ago. My church community gathered around me and God helped get me through." Think on how God has helped in your story, and share that.

It's also not so much, "Let me tell you the entire story of scripture right now..." but, "that reminds me of something which St. Paul says. It's been really helpful to me." Share the way God has worked in your life through forgiveness and second chances, comfort in the hard times, and faithfulness always. While you do, add in those stories of Scripture which come to mind. Study Scripture, so that you'll have the words to say when that time comes.

So go! Tell your story. Join with that woman who met Jesus and then can't help but mention Him to those she knows, saying:

"Come, see a man who told me everything I ever did. Could this be the Messiah?" -John 4:29

As we BLESS others, we share the good news of this Messiah. The God who loves us. Who came for us. Who pursues us when we stray. We share Jesus! "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news!"


Save the Date—Vacation Bible School

Kindergarten through Eighth Grade Registration 2020-21

The registration fee for the 2020-21 school year for students in Preschool through 8th grade is \$100.00 per student. You are asked to meet with Mrs. Camin, our Bookkeeper, in the school office to complete all financial paperwork. Your re-enrollment is not complete until BOTH the online and financial portion are done. If you do not complete the re-enrollment by March 15, then a "late" enrollment fee of \$100/student is assessed. There is a computer available for use in the school office lobby to complete the online portion. Please contact the school office with any questions. We would be happy to help! Jennifer Skojac, our Director of Admissions, will be happy to share the blessings of a quality, Christian education with all interested families. Website Tour — This Week @ Calvary

Calvary's website is full of useful information about our mission, ministries and events. You can access it at www.clcs.org on your computers, laptops, and mobile devices (tablets and phones). Each month we will "tour" a different area of the website to help you become familiar with all its useful features. This month we look the This Week @Calvary page. As its title would suggest, this page focuses on what's happening in the current week. The main section is broken into three "tabs", each of which focuses on different information.



CALENDAR HIGHLIGHTS PRAYERS

The CALENDAR tab has the detailed calendar for the current week. There is also a link at the bottom of this tab to go to the complete Calendar of Events, which contains all events currently scheduled for the foreseeable future.

CALENDAR HIGHLIGHTS PRAYERS

The HIGHLIGHTS tab contains details about key events, programs, and initiatives at Calvary. Much of this information is the same as what is sent out in the Monday morning CLCS Weekly Update email.

CALENDAR HIGHLIGHTS PRAYERS

The PRAYERS tab is a listing of members, friends, and families of Calvary who need your prayer support. These are typically the same prayers as are listed in the weekly bulletin.

LATEST SERMON

Under the tabs section, there is the LATEST SERMON. Clicking on this will take you to a detail page, including sermon notes and an audio recording. It is a great way to catch up on the sermon if you were unable to attend worship, or to review the sermon if you did.

DOCUMENT LINKS

On the right side of the page, there is a sidebar titled "DOCUMENT LINKS". This sidebar has buttons that will take you to bulletins and bulletin announcements for the current week. It also contains buttons for the current month's Newsletter, Calendar, and Birthdays & Anniversaries.

How do I get to the This Week @Calvary page?

There are several ways you can get to this page on Calvary's website. First, in the Welcome section of the homepage, there is a button labeled "THIS WEEK @CALVARY". Click on the button and you will be taken to the page. Also, from anywhere on the website, you can always click on the "hamburger" icon () at the top right corner of the screen, which brings up a full menu to all the pages on the website. In this menu, click on ABOUT US, then THIS WEEK.

Understanding the 2nd Quarter Financial Statement

Each quarter Calvary's Business Manager, Gary Bugher, prepares a financial statement that is included in the bulletin and the newsletter. What areas should you be paying attention to on that statement? The second fiscal quarter ended 1/31/20 shows that Calvary received revenues of \$1,333,975 which is \$24,005 short of the budget of \$1,357,980.

The decrease in revenue came from a dip in giving to the general fund which received \$40,896 less than budget and \$45,115 less than last year at this point. Matching gifts (funds contributed from employers that match contributions by their employees) was also \$25,497 down from budget and down from last year. Tuition and fees are tracking ahead of budget and last year.

In response to decreased funds coming in, expenses have been watched closely and a mild winter is helping reduce some facility fees.

The quarterly statement also listed the contributions Calvary made as a congregation to organizations such as Lutheran High School, El Salvador and India Missions, Camp Lakeview, and Habitat for Humanity. Thankfully we are reminded our mortgage balance has been eliminated and we do not need to use our line of credit. When these statements are shared, please take a moment to understand the needs of the congregation as we work together in God's kingdom.

Turning Your Commitment into Action

In January we prayerfully considered our response to God's generosity in the new year. Have you put your commitment into action? Was that an increase in time dedicated to service, prayer or worship? Was it a change in your giving? If your contribution is set up online you can log back in at any time and change the amount, frequency, or funds supported.

Are you a Thrivent member?

Eligible members can recommend where Thrivent distributes a portion of its charitable funding by directing Choice Dollars®. March 31 is the deadline to direct the dollars that have accumulated in 2019 or those funds expire. Calvary Lutheran Church and Calvary Lutheran School are two options where you can direct Choice Dollars. Full details are on the Thrivent website -

The fund is currently supporting Calvary's Youth & Family Director, Sam Troemel, who is attending Concordia Seminary's Specific Ministry Pastor (SMP) Program. This is a four-year state of the art distance education program that prepares men for specific pastoral ministries in The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod.

EPIC Center Library News


EPIC Center Book Study

Over the three weeks of **March 22nd**, **29th**, **and April 5th**, we will be holding a book study at the 9:30 hour in the EPIC Center Library. The book we will be reading and discussing is **Southernmost**, a novel by Silas House. The story is contemporary, and set in a changing Appalachia, where Asher Sharp, a Pentecostal pastor starts to question his own long-held moral beliefs. His "last straw" involves the events during and immediately after a catastrophic flood decimates the area, and in particular

the pastor's congregation, with Asher losing nearly everything; his job, his marriage, and he fears, even his beloved son. The book will give us plenty to discuss about faith, parenting, tolerance, and how to live out our Christian values in a real and changing world, where others, even fellow believers, hold views diametrically opposed to ours.
