- 1) [Jesus said] **“I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel.”**

- 2) [Jesus said] **“It is not right to take the children’s bread and throw it to the dogs.”**

- 3) [Jesus said] **“Your faith has made you well.”**
We hear this in Matthew 9, Mark 5 and 10, Luke 8, 17, and 18.

- 4) [Jesus said] **“O woman, great is your faith! Be it done for you as you desire.”**

- 5) **Her prayer is heard because of her Faith.**

- 6) **She persists because she believes:**
 - a) That Jesus can help her.
 - b) That Jesus will help her.

Text for Personal Reflection:

²¹ And Jesus went away from there and withdrew to the district of Tyre and Sidon. ²² And behold, a Canaanite woman from that region came out and was crying, "Have mercy on me, O Lord, Son of David; my daughter is severely oppressed by a demon." ²³ But he did not answer her a word. And his disciples came and begged him, saying, "Send her away, for she is crying out after us." ²⁴ He answered, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." ²⁵ But she came and knelt before him, saying, "Lord, help me." ²⁶ And he answered, "It is not right to take the children's bread and throw it to the dogs." ²⁷ She said, "Yes, Lord, yet even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their masters' table." ²⁸ Then Jesus answered her, "O woman, great is your faith! Be it done for you as you desire." And her daughter was healed instantly. *(Matthew 15)*
