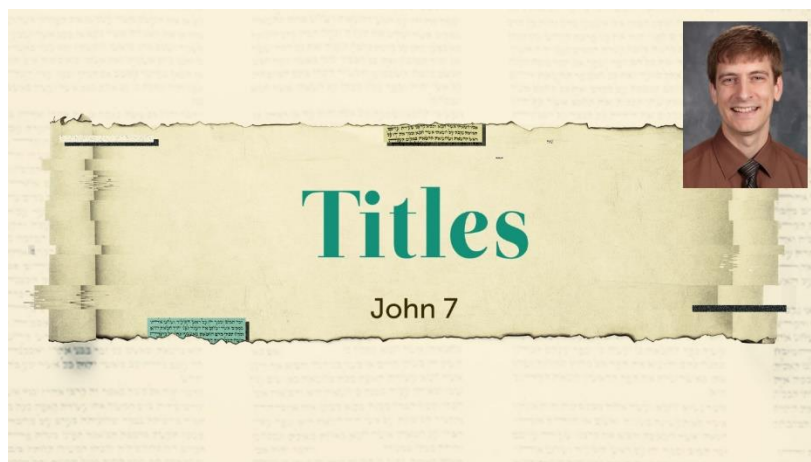

- “Who am I?”
- What we think of Jesus—what we call him—matters.
- When God calls us his children, nothing else matters.

We are “called children of God; and so we are.” (1 John 3:1)

“If anyone thirsts, let him come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, ‘Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water.’ ” (John 7:38)

- God’s titles flow out of us to other people. These simple words which we get to speak have the awesome power to change people’s lives.
 - He tells us:
 - You are “**forgiven**.”
 - You are my “**children**.”
 - You are my “**saints**”—my “**holy ones**”—those whom I have **set apart** by my cleansing death and resurrection to be my people.
