1. <u>United</u> as one.

Holy Father, keep them in your name, which you have given me, that they may be one, even as we are one. ... But now I am coming to you, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves. *(John 17:11b, 13)*

2. <u>*Planted*</u> where we are.

I do not ask that you take them out of the world, but that you keep them from the evil one. ... Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. (*John 17:15, 17*)

That person is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither – whatever they do prospers. Not so the wicked! They are like chaff that the wind blows away. (*Psalm 1:3–5*)

3. <u>Sent</u> to where we live.

As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. (John 17:18)
