From the Pastors

Today has been one of those days—one where plans fall apart in all sorts of ways. I'm sure you've experienced that at least once before in your life... maybe you're even experiencing it right now! As I've reflected on this experience, my mind keeps coming back to one verse of Psalm 29. It's a wonderful psalm written by King David, so if you can, take some time to read through and meditate on it before you continue. It's short, and it should only take a couple minutes.

I'll summarize briefly. The Psalm paints a vivid picture of God's awesomeness and especially His power over creation. God's voice thunders over the whole earth. He merely speaks, and countless amazing things happen. Everything in this psalm is a wonder: God's voice shatters trees, destroys nations, shakes the wilderness, and it even makes the deer give birth. It's so wondrous, that all the people in God's temple can't help but cry, "Glory!" If this psalm were originally written in English, I bet the people would simply be saying, "Wow!"

This is all good stuff, but it's not the verse I'm thinking of. The verse which is coming to mind is verse 10, "The LORD sits enthroned over the flood; the LORD sits enthroned as king forever." What's the point David is making in this psalm? In the midst of all the chaos—falling trees, fallen nations, a shaking wilderness—God is in control. In fact, if the flood is our focus in this psalm, we know that God is not only in control, he's using what may seem catastrophic for the good of his creation. This is a lesson Paul will teach almost a thousand years later: "all things work together for good, for those who are called according to His purpose" (Romans 8:28). What good news for us, God's children, called according to His purpose!

A lot has been "shaken up" in our world in the last few years. And a lot more may be shaken up still. But one truth remains unshakable: the God who made it all sits enthroned over the storms of our life. We may be tossed to and fro by the waves, but we have a God who is unphased by it all—and not only that—we have a God who is willing and able to help in the midst of it, too. Thanks be to God in Christ Jesus our Lord!

From Your Executive Director

This past June, the members of Calvary exercised one of their most important jobs within the congregation: the election of new officer and directors. We are a member-driven church, where the members entrust certain individuals to make most decisions for the benefit of all. This is one thing that differentiates us from most other denominations.

I am one of those who were elected, and for those newer members who may not know me, I am taking a moment to introduce myself. And for those of you who do know me, especially our long-standing members, I am honored and humbled to once again serve our congregation in this role, which I last held from 2000 to 2004.

If you go to any of the LCMS churches on the southside, you will likely run into one of my extended family members. I was baptized at Emmaus by Pastor Krueckeberg, grew up at Concordia under Pastor Strassen, and transferred to Calvary in 1970 when I started confirmation classes under Pastor Meier – and I've been a member since. In addition to serving Calvary, I've also served our Lutheran family as one of Calvary's representatives to the Concordia Cemetery board (Calvary is one of the owners of the cemetery), and was CFO at Lutherwood from 2010-2013, where I worked to reengage the Lutheran congregations in Central Indiana back into that organization.

In other words, my Lutheran – and my German – roots run deep, back to the founding of St. John, St. Paul's, and Zion in New Palestine, where some of my ancestors were among the initial members. I have a deep appreciation for our church, our doctrine, and our heritage.

Because of this deep appreciation, anything I do is always tempered with a level of respect for the past. But just like we don't drive a car constantly looking only in the rear-view mirror, instead focusing on the road ahead of us, I also am aware that as the world around us changes, we must be cognizant of changes, and consider how do we bring the never-changing world of Christ into an ever-changing world.

As we look at things like this over the coming months, I will keep the congregation informed through what I plan to be a monthly column for the Chronicle: communication is the key!

I experienced a wide range of emotions from family members that evening. Both dread and a sense of pride were shared. Being chosen often creates a special feeling. Even when your name is called as you wait for a table at a restaurant. Do you remember lining up at recess as teams were picked? Once again emotions of pride and dread were felt. Scholarship Tax Credit Information

"Too Good to Be True?!"

God has provided a unique opportunity to help fund the Christian education of our Calvary students. The Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization of Indiana, Inc. has been identified as a Scholarship Granting Organization. Scholarships through private and corporate donations are granted to Calvary student families whose income is less than 300% of the Federal free or reduced hot lunch guidelines.

Updates from the 2021-2022 School Year:

- 28 families/individuals contributed over \$125,000.00 towards this Scholarship Tax Credit
- This funded the need for 52 Scholarship grants.
- Many grant recipients are now enjoying the benefit of a CHOICE State voucher.
- All Calvary Lutheran Church and School student aid from the General Fund has been eliminated.

New Information

- Nearly \$700,000.00 has been gathered through the state tax credit initiative over the past 10 years.
- The donor base has been virtually unchanged over these years.
- Donors are increasing their gifts. Why? The "Too Good to be True" aspects
- We are asking for previous year participants in this program to communicate all the benefits inviting two-three others to prayerfully consider involvement increasing our donor base.
- Personal tax credits that remain against your tax liability may be used for up to 9 years.
- All is to now be accomplished online. www.lutheranSGO.org
- Be sure to identify Calvary Lutheran School, Indianapolis as the recipient of your donation.

How may I help?

Donations are currently being accepted. We are in need of \$85,000.00 to fully fund this year's grants. Please prayerfully consider your involvement and support in this most worthwhile program. **Urgency-**

With the change in household income levels other schools are granting SGO's as well to give their students a track to a CHOICE scholarship. Only \$18.5 million in tax credits are available during the state fiscal year. Please make your donation prior to October 31 to ensure your Indiana state tax credit.

Multiple Benefits for Calvary Lutheran School students, the private or corporate donor, and Calvary Lutheran Church

- 1. Students and their families accepted in this program will receive a scholarship grant per child enrolled in kindergarten-8th grade at Calvary.
- The donor will receive a 50% Indiana State tax credit for every dollar donated. Example: A
 donation of \$1000.00 will result in a tax credit of \$500.00 towards your Indiana income tax liability.
 Private as well as corporate donations will receive this benefit.
- 3. A student receiving a Scholarship grant in kindergarten will then be eligible for a CHOICE State voucher through 12th grade. This could result in a total of over \$80,000.00 towards Christian Education.

What happens in the future?

Children receiving a scholarship grant are eligible the following school year to convert this grant to a CHOICE State voucher. This again has eliminated the need for congregational funded scholarship dollars. Children will have the opportunity to hear God's Word through your giving. God continues to open doors to others once thought closed due to financial needs. Your assistance in this program is so greatly appreciated!


