1) <u>Chasing</u> after "<u>bread</u>."

¹ In the days when the judges ruled there was a famine in the land, and a man of Bethlehem in Judah went to sojourn in the country of Moab, he and his wife and his two sons . . . ⁶ Then she arose with her daughters-in-law to return from the country of Moab, for she had heard that the Lord had visited his people and given them food. ⁷ So she set out with her two daughters-in-law on the way to return to the land of Judah. *(Ruth 1:1, 6–7)*

2) An <u>example</u> of <u>love</u>.

Then they lifted up their voices and wept again. And Orpah kissed her mother-in-law, but Ruth clung to her. (*Ruth 1:14*)

3) A <u>confession</u> of <u>faith</u>.

¹⁶ But Ruth said, "Do not urge me to leave you or to return from following you. For where you go I will go, and where you lodge I will lodge. Your people shall be my people, and your God my God. ¹⁷ Where you die I will die, and there will I be buried. May the Lord do so to me and more also if anything but death parts me from you." (*Ruth 1:16–17*)

4) The <u>epitome</u> of <u>grace</u>.

¹¹ The saying is trustworthy, for: If we have died with him, we will also live with him; ¹² if we endure, we will also reign with him; if we deny him, he also will deny us; ¹³ if we are faithless, he remains faithful—for he cannot deny himself
