

1) Jesus criticized the Pharisees for <u>mechanical faithfulness</u>.

"Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you tithe mint and dill and cumin, and have neglected the weightier matters of the law: justice and mercy and faithfulness. These you ought to have done, without neglecting the others."

(Matthew 23:23)

 Martin Luther criticized the Catholic Church for selling <u>indulgences</u>, for withholding the <u>grace of God</u> which should be <u>free</u>.

For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Romans 6:23)

3) When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ said, "<u>Repent</u>," he willed the entire life of believers to be one of <u>repentance</u>.

From that time Jesus began to preach, saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

(Matthew 4:17)

²⁴ Then Jesus told his disciples, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. ²⁵ For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. (*Matthew 16:24*–25)

4) Our love should not for the sake of any <u>personal gain</u>, but <u>free</u> because God's love is <u>free for us</u>.

¹⁰ In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins. ¹¹ Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. (1 John 4: 10–11)
